

Lakeside Unity Area Service Committee,

I want to say first that I'm grateful we care enough about this Area to take the guidelines seriously. I know everyone speaking up is doing so because they want to protect NA and make sure we don't repeat mistakes. I respect that. At the same time, I believe these guidelines need to reflect the conscience of the whole Area — not just the concerns of one group, including my own. Every voice matters, but no single voice should carry more weight than the rest of the body.

In Narcotics Anonymous literature, we're reminded that our leaders are trusted servants and that they do not govern. That means we operate on trust, accountability, and spiritual principles — not control. If we write these guidelines in a way that assumes future trusted servants can't be trusted unless everything is tightly legislated, we're sending a message of distrust before they've even had a chance to serve. I'm fully in favor of clear financial safeguards and transparency. But there's a difference between reasonable protection and writing a rulebook built around fear.

I also want to acknowledge that the Guidelines Committee has put in extra effort. They've held two additional special meetings to hear concerns, and most of those concerns have come from one group. That shows willingness to listen, and I appreciate that. But I don't think it's healthy or sustainable for this process to keep stretching primarily to satisfy one perspective. Hearing minority opinion is part of our spiritual process. Allowing the process to be continually redirected by one group isn't. At some point, we have to trust the collective conscience of the Area and let it move forward.

What I'm asking for is balance. Let's create guidelines that protect our funds and provide clarity, but also reflect trust in the members who will serve after us. If we stay grounded in unity and principles instead of fear, I believe we'll land in a place that most of us can stand behind — and that's what will ultimately keep our Area strong.
